Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen



The past and the future crossed paths for me recently. I had just had the amazing experience of seeing, in person, the sculpture of "David", a masterpiece of the Italian Renaissance created in marble from 1501 to 1504 by artist Michelangelo. To say it was breath-taking is an understatement. With that experience fresh in my mind, I watched an episode of 60 Minutes set in the very place north of Tuscany, Italy were Michelangelo found a perfect block of marble for his artistic efforts. But, times have changed. Now, the "artist" is Robo, a part of "a fleet of robots shaking up the art world, carving with pinpoint precision, and in record time." No doubt what one artist said about this is true, Michelangelo would be rolling in his grave.

Instead of a hammer and chisel, a 13-foot zinc alloy arm and a spinning diamond-crusted finger do the sculpting in 10 times less time than using the old-fashioned way. Of course, artists are still needed to program the robot with the creative image and plan for a sculpture, which is brain-intensive work.

Still...as I consider the breath-taking 17-foot-high "David", now in the Galleria dell'Accademia in Florence, Italy, and what it took to conceive and create it in the 14th century, I am unimpressed by technology, and in awe of 26 -year-old Michelangelo, gifted by God to create such an example of physical perfection.

I read that when sculpting, Michelangelo regarded a single block of stone as containing all the possible conceptions for a work of art and believed that the artist's task is sculpting the marble block to reveal the ideal form within. He contended that he was merely liberating figures that were already existent in the stone, and that he could see them in his mind's eye.

Still, lengthy preparatory work was done before the actual sculpting began; this included sketches, drawings and the making of small-scale terracotta or wax models. He made his steel chisels himself and worked on a scaffolding to reach every part of the massive sculpture.

There are, of course, books written on the artist and his masterpiece, so I'll pause in sharing those details, and stick to theology. God created human beings with the ability to do amazing things. This is particularly clear to me when I see centuries-old cathedrals, and the art in them, and reflect that they were built without the benefit of electricity, let alone technology.

Could 21st century people accomplish this, I often ask myself. The answer is that they probably could, but the world has changed, as have the ways people use the brains and hands that God has given them. I can't help but wonder, though, if, as was true of the artists and builders of earlier times, the motivator is to do that which will glorify God? That motivation is obvious in centuries-old art and churches, and perhaps, is what pushed their creators to do what we now find amazing. It's difficult for me to have that same sense of awe about Robo sculptor or other forms of Artificial Intelligence (AI). Perhaps that is because it's ... well ... artificial, while Michelange-lo and God are the real deal.

Collaboration with Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Update

A meeting of representatives from Faith Lutheran and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (HTLC) was held on June 9 to discuss the future of the collaboration of the two congregations. It was led by Pastor Mitch Phillips, Assistant to the Bishop, Northeastern Ohio Synod (NEOS). Earlier in the year, each congregation held "Listening Sessions" for its congregation members, the content of which was considered by the Councils and Collaborative Team leaders prior to the June 9 meeting.

Faith's Collaborative Team met and made the following recommendations to the Church Council, based on the discussion on June 9.

- 1. To continue building a relationship with HTLC through collaborative efforts, but not to pursue a joint call of rostered leaders (clergy, deacon) at this time.
- 2. To develop a Team of individuals from each congregation to plan collaboration efforts that will strengthen relationships among the congregations' members, encourage growth in faith and enhance the proclamation of the Gospel in the community (outreach).
- 3. Potentially share non-rostered staff, i.e., those who are not clergy or deacons, as opportunities arise or as is beneficial for ministry.
- 4. Consider inviting other congregations to join the collaborative effort, with guidance from the NEOS.

Faith's Church Council met on June 16 and Holy Trinity's Church Council met on June 17. Both groups approved this plan for future collaboration.





Congregation Council

Faith Lutheran Committee Spotlight



This month, we are highlighting our Synod Assembly Voting Members, who are elected at our annual meeting in November. This year's representatives were Pastor Tim and Martha Keeler who attended the Northeastern Ohio Synod Assembly, which was held virtually on Saturday, May 17, with many representatives attending at "watch parties."

The synod voted to change the requirement for representatives to next year's assembly. Each congregation may bring up to three voting members, "provided one of those members is a person who is: Black, Indigenous, or Person of Color (BIPOC); part of the Queer community; and/or under 30 years of age."

At the assembly, policies of the larger church are discussed and voted upon. There is usually some reading to do before the assembly and that takes less than five hours of time. The Synod Assembly will be held in person again in 2026.

ELCA DAY OF SERVICE



This year marks the 12th anniversary of the annual day of service which will take place on September 7. Thanks to Loralee Daily for preparing the following message:

The ELCA Day of Service is Sunday, **September 7, 2025**. One of the projects for this day will be assembling the Lutheran World Relief Personal Care (Health) Kits. In order to do this, members are asked to donate the items needed for the kits, beginning in August. There will be a display table and containers for the items set up in the Welcome Center, beginning on Sunday, August 3.

LWR Personal Care Health Kits

- One light-weight bath-size towel dark color recommended (20" X 40" to 52" X 27")
- Two or three bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz) of soap, any brand, in the original wrapping (total of 8 to 9 oz of soap per kit)
- One adult size toothbrush in its original wrapping
- One sturdy comb (no picks or fine-toothed combs) remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper (attached file), remove packaging

Additionally, we will be looking to identify a project similar to last year's outdoor service work in which 13 members participated at Norma Setteur's home.

It is their belief that everyone deserves to die in the presence of care, compassion, and dignity, and that no one should die alone. They also shared stories about a few past residents. There were twelve participants in the meeting and five expressed interest in exploring volunteer service in the future.
