Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

> "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" "We Plow the Fields and Scatter" "For the Fruit of All Creation" "Praise and Thanksgiving, God we would Offer"

These are some of the "Stewardship" or "Thanksgiving" hymns we sing in October and November, reminding us that the world is God's own field... that our praise is for all things living, that God has made good... that as we share the harvest, God's will is done ... and that we have no gifts to offer for all that God's love imparts, other than what God most treasures, our hearts. I enjoy singing them because of the imagery they project. They stir up gratitude, which is not always easy to dredge up or to share. Yet, doing so can have a significant, positive impact on our lives and world.

Other words for gratitude are appreciation and thankfulness; all three are important for those who live, as we do this autumn in the United States, in a divisive and cynical environment.

The Mayo Clinic Health System reports that expressing gratitude is associated with a host of mental and physical benefits. "Studies have shown that feeling thankful can improve sleep, mood and immunity. Gratitude can decrease anxiety, difficulties with chronic pain and risk of disease", according to its website. Also, "...behavior changes biology. Positive gestures benefit you by releasing oxytocin, a hormone that helps connect people." Given that, shouldn't gratitude be practiced daily? Consider these acts of gratitude:

**Expressing gratitude**: Take time to thank others; do so in-person, on the phone or with a note, e-mail or text. Be as specific and positive as possible about why you are grateful for, or appreciate, them. Focus not only on the person's actions, but also attributes.

**Gratitude journaling**: Write down a few things for which you're thankful each day; be as detailed and descriptive as possible.

**Gratitude meditation**: Each week take time to reflect on what you're grateful for by reviewing that week's journal entries. Do they reveal any reasons to thank others, or God?

**Prayer**: Spend time giving thanks to God for what you have been given, including spiritual gifts – grace, forgiveness, guidance, hope.

Practicing gratitude can improve one's well-being and relationships. It can also make others feel appreciated and happier. And, it is certainly a way to strengthen one's faith

As we are reminded from Colossians 2:6-7:

"As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."



# Giving Thanks for Faithful Staff, Leaders

We give thanks for Faith member **Judy Lee**, who for 35 years has served in the staff position of Financial Manager (previously Treasurer) and is retiring at the end of 2024. # Collaboration with Holy Trinity Lutheran Church What's Next?



Since July, Faith Lutheran Church (FLC) and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (HTLC) have been holding monthly collaborative events. The events for this year will end with "Midweek Devotions and Lunch" at FLC led by HTLC staff member Rachel Nunez in November and the "Procession of Advent Lessons and Carols" service at HTLC in December. The goal of this six-month series of events has been to strengthen the congregations' relationship with one another through intentional interaction.

The logical question is "What's next?" First though, please note what is **not planned.** The focus at this time is not on combining the congregations; both congregations will continue maintaining their buildings and holding weekly worship services. What **is being discussed** is sharing staff – including pastoral staff – and sharing ministry.

In November, both Councils, other designated leaders from HTLC and FLC's Collaborative Team will meet with Pastor Jonathan Stufft, Assistant to the Bishop, for a "Visioning Session". Depending on the feedback from that event, "Listening Sessions" for congregation members could be planned in early 2025.

Participation by other ELCA congregations with FLC and HTLC is not planned at this time, although that continues to be a future possibility.



There is still a little more gardening work to be done this year. During the first week of November (weather permitting) the ground fabric and their anchor pins will need to be pulled up along with the plant roots and remains. Please let David Simpson or Nicole know if you would like to assist with this activity.

Finally, here is a message that Pastor Jean sent to our gardeners:

Hello Gardeners,

Some good news and a story.

The good news is that our **total delivered to OPEN M this growing season (as of October 7) was 2,212.09 pounds**, in spite of the critters and the drought. Congratulations and thanks to everyone!

Now for the story ... I planted a pepper that was brought by our generous plant donor, but did not know exactly what it was; it turned out to be a jalapeño pepper. I donated some of them to OPEN M, marked HOT, but also took some to AsiaOhio, a group that supports immigrants, and that has a food pantry, knowing that that culture likes spicy food. You should have seen how excited they were to receive those peppers, which they called "Ghost Peppers". One of the pantry supervisors said she had been looking for them at local Farmer's Markets and had not seen any. "Our people will be so excited!" she said. Sometimes it's the small things that matter.... I hope to make at least one more delivery to them.

#### **DLM SEPTEMBER**

#### INTERFAITH JUSTICE ALLIANCE

Based on a FiveThirtyEight/Ipsos survey conducted May 26-June 6, 2022, among a sample of 1,691 adults that was weighted to match the general population. Respondents could select up to three issues.

One of the final projects was the staining of a rather long ramp with almost 200 spindles that the team had previously constructed several years ago. This project has permitted 97-year-old Edna to exit her house and experience freedom and less social isolation.

Additionally, unsafe steps were replaced and flashing boards were repaired on both sides of her house during the two days of service extension.


