Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

Lent arrives on March 5 with Ash Wednesday, and then continues until April 13, Palm Sunday, when Holy Week begins.

Again, this year we will be participating in the Interfaith Justice Series on five Wednesdays in Lent, beginning on March 12 when our congregation is the host. Each evening there will be a worship service, meal and program. A change this year is that for the first three weeks the evening's activities will begin with worship at 6 p.m., followed by the meal and program.

The program this year is interactive and will focus on learning a skill – how to listen to and communicate with people with varying points of view. The overall theme for this year's program is "How to Disagree with Love and Respect."

Presenters on the first three Wednesdays are representatives of **Braver Angels: Ohio**; an overview of this group will be given each evening. The focus the first evening will include considering how our "stories" shape our points-of-view and learning skills to listen and connect more deeply with those we care about and with whom we disagree. The second Wednesday's program focus will be on family roles, how they influence our points-of-view and developing skills to engage with family members. Week Three will explore how we each contribute to polarization and how to avoid doing so.

The schedules for weeks four and five are different than the previous weeks. On April 2 at St. Hilary, the meal will be at 6:15 p.m., followed by worship at 7 p.m. and the presentation at 7:30 p.m. The leaders that night will be Bill Shaul from Braver Angels and Ted Wetzel from "Fighting to Understand." They will lead the group in considering how to put the tools learned in the previous weeks to use.

The series will end with "something completely different" on April 9 at Temple Israel. The program is called "*Dinner and a Fight"* (*Dialogue*) and is led by Ted Wetzel. This will be an experience worth having! A brief devotion and the meal will begin at 6 p.m., followed by the program at 6:45 p.m.

This series is a great opportunity to try something new, learn skills for life, as well as worship and share fellowship with people from four other faith communities. It will be especially great to welcome new participants.

(Reminder: registration is required for each night.)



The programs on **March 12, 19, 26 and April 9**, begin at 6 p.m. On **April 2** it begins at 6:15 p.m. We will be hosting the first of the series here at Faith Lutheran Church and our volunteers will be preparing the meal. (See flyer on page 5 for details.)

This year's approach will incorporate principles developed in two programs. One is Braver Angels, and the other is Dinner and a Fight (Dialogue). The program will be very different this year. Instead of learning about a problem or social justice issue from experts, we will be experiencing how we may move forward from polarized sides to a place of common ground or understanding. Although the Ohio Mission has been discontinued, there was agreement to explore a similar but local project for this year. We could possibly associate this with September's ELCA "God's Work, Our Hands" Day of Service.

The Team also reviewed the enormous success of the Loads of Faith project during 2024. Not only did it receive external funding from the Akron Community Foundation, but it also experienced a significant increase in demand for service both at the Wallhaven and North Hill locations. With the growth in numbers, a decision was made to examine what changes, if any, would be beneficial to meet the expanding number of families seeking the laundry service.

Another discussion item was the descriptions of our Outreach Ministries as they appear on the website. It was decided to review these and update where needed. Suggestions are welcome, so please take a few minutes to click and read them.

AKRON AREA INTERFAITH COUNCIL (AAIC)

In response to various government actions and statements, the AAIC has submitted the letter, copied below, for publication by the Akron Beacon Journal. The letter quotes ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton responding to a specific accusation that the ELCA was illegally taking taxpayer money for some of its humanitarian work.

To The Editor:

The first weeks of the new Trump administration have been filled with attacks on religious liberty. When Episcopal Bishop Mariann Budde asked the president during an inauguration service to "have mercy" on LGBTQ children and migrant workers it sparked criticism from numerous Trumpian pundits. The second week featured VP Vance attacking the Catholic Church for assisting immigrants and refugees and suggesting they care more about money than people.

Then, on February 1, disgraced former Lt. General Michael Flynn attacked the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), accusing them, without evidence, of illegally taking taxpayer money. He also used scare quotes to question the religiosity of Lutherans.

ELCA leaders quickly responded to the attacks. Global Refuge issued a statement condemning "in the strongest possible terms, the false accusations lodged against our humanitarian work."

Similarly, ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton released a video responding to "false allegations." She accused those pushing "misinformation and baseless doubt" of violating the commandment against "bearing false witness." She added. "Our call to love our neighbors as ourselves remains steadfast."

The Department of Homeland Security announced it will no longer recognize churches as "protected areas". Immediately Five Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) filed suit stating this directive infringes on their religious liberty.

Attacks on Christian groups for caring about marginalized people shows part of the danger of the Christian Nationalistic-fueled administration. But the attacks are also awakening a response. The Akron Area Interfaith Council supports the efforts of those like the Quakers and Bishops Budde and Eaton, and hope that they inspire more among the faith community to speak out against policies that are contrary to our moral and spiritual values.

AAIC members were each presented with a "Khada" which is a ceremonial scarf which symbolizes goodwill, auspiciousness and compassion. It is a traditional way of offering greetings and blessings to special guests. The beautiful people of Nepal clearly know how to make one feel special.

COMMUNITY AGENCIES NETWORKING

<u>Grace House Akron</u> has requested an opportunity to describe its services to our congregation. We plan on providing such an opportunity sometime after Easter on a Sunday between services.

In early February, David Simpson did a site visit of the <u>Peter Maurin Center</u> on Old South Main Street. The organization's mission is to serve *with the goal to provide* hope, strength, and resources to individuals in our community who struggle to survive on their own. The Center is open to guests on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays for meals served between 12 and 2 p.m. Every Sunday, a local church provides the guests with a prepared meal. These churches provide between 1,350 and 1,500 meals each month. Participating churches include:

- St. Sebastian/Akron
- St. Hilary/Fairlawn

- Holy Family/Stow
- Sacred Heart/Wadsworth
- Our Lady of Guadalupe/Macedonia

- Ancient Order of Hibernians

The facilities are also open after hours throughout the night whenever winter's frigid temperatures plunge to 10°F or below and accommodates between 20 and 40 people.

Other services include a food pantry, bus pass program, bike donation service and health screening as well as a community garden.

FYI - UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST STATEMENT

The Board of Trustees of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Akron shared this statement from the pulpit on January 26, 2025:

"The Unitarian Universalist Church of Akron condemns the federal government definition of two sexes only. This definition is not only scientifically false, it is divisive, hateful, and dehumanizing. We know that human gender identity is complex and ultimately up to each person to define for themselves. Unitarian Universalism affirms love for all people, especially those on the margins. We know that we are all interdependent and interconnected to each other, despite our outward differences. There is no such thing as other people's children. They are all our own. The Unitarian Universalist Church of Akron is a haven for those who feel unsafe in these difficult times. We are a beacon of love, justice, and freedom for all in Fairlawn, Akron, and Northeast Ohio. We welcome all, and pledge to support our beloved trans/nonbinary+ community."




