Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen



Life is fragile.

By now, the congregation is aware of the sad situation with my friend Anne in St. Louis. I went to visit her and her husband Ed on February 27, for a vacation weekend before Lent began. That night, she tripped on a table leg and fell in such a way that she broke her neck and was paralyzed from mid-chest down. After it became clear that she would need a permanent breathing tube and would not recover use of her limbs even after surgery, she made the decision to go into hospice care. She had been the caregiver for her husband, who has various health issues. So, I stayed five more days than I had planned to be with her and support Ed and their daughters. Anne died on Wednesday morning, March 12. As I write this, I am making plans to attend the funeral on March 23.

I met Ed, Anne and their daughters, who were from North Carolina, in 1985 when Ed and I were seminary students and were in a Greek study group together. As we strove to learn ancient Greek, and survive that class, Ed decided that I would be a good friend for Anne. They invited me over for supper and it turned out he was right, even though she was 10 years my senior. We lived in the same location only once, for a few months, but our friendship thrived over the 40 years that followed. The girls, Susan, Marian and Elizabeth, who were 2, 5 and 7 years old when we met, called me Aunt Jean. Anne and I became "chosen sisters". We occasionally traveled together, visited one another often and shared long phone conversations, but mostly we gave one another unconditional love and support as we faced the ups and downs of our lives. She was especially there for me during the down times, and as I made life-changing decisions.

We all know that our lives can change in the blink of an eye, which is exactly what happened that Thursday night. The irony is that Anne was intentional about maintaining good health and was physically fit. She deftly managed the details of their lives and was safety-conscious lest an accident occurred that would impact her ability to do so. In addition to that, during the three years they had been in St. Louis (having moved there to be close to their daughter), she had not only made friends in her neighborhood but was credited for bringing people together and creating a caring community. She was active in her Lutheran church, a true devotee of Sunday worship, and had developed close friendships there. She continued to be politically astute, advocating for justice and inclusion, as she had always done, particularly in her last job as an Immigration Attorney. Whether it was the grocery store, the pharmacy, the doctor's office or the YMCA, people knew and loved Anne because of the extra effort she took to learn about their lives and encourage them in their work. Even in the hospital and hospice center, she focused on others in the midst of her devastating circumstances. She no doubt offered more thanks and supportive comments, with her distinctive southern accent, than those who cared for her had received in the past month or even year.

As death approached, Anne was Anne - determined, compassionate, intelligent, analytical, quirky, humorous and devoted to those she loved, including me. The trauma of those days was lessened for us all as she thanked us for being in her life, spoke of a good death, was strong in faith, and confident that the decision she had made was the right one, and that we all would make our way without her.

We will...but it won't be easy. I hope not to forget that life is fragile.

#### INTERFAITH JUSTICE ALLLIANCE -- SAVE THE REMAINING DATES

Please attend and encourage other congregation members to participate.

The first presentation was held at our church and was very well attended with about 150 participants. The following Braver Angels principles (identified in the acronym iLAPP) for navigating difficult conversations were reviewed and attendees were provided a role-play experience to practice them.

\*Invite: (a conversation): "Would you like to talk about this? Is now a good time?"

\*Listen: "Help me understand more about how...." or "I'm curious about...."

Turn off your 'inner debater' and 'rebuttal listening'.

\*<u>Acknowledge:</u> "What I hear you saying is..." (paraphrase: content and emotion)

Ask, "Did I get that right?"

\*<u>Pivot:</u> "I can agree with you that...." or "I'm with you on..." (Find something!) Ask, "Are you willing to hear a different Point of View (POV)?"

\*Perspective: Tell your story /experience. Learn theirs.

The audience was actively engaged with enthusiastic participation. Comments shared demonstrated appreciation for the session.

#### FREE LAUNDRY


The City Of Akron hosted "Free Tumble Together Washing And Drying Event" on March 5, at the West Side Laundromat at 853 Copley Rd. The city provided free washing and drying for up to three (3) loads of laundry per household. The event was only open to City of Akron residents. This program was made possible through grant funding from ServeOhio, the state's Commission on Service and Volunteerism and the City of Akron. "I believe everyone deserves the dignity of clean clothing," said Mayor Malik. "The feedback from these events last year was so positive and expressed a continued need for free washing and drying events to help those without access to a washer or dryer in their home. When times are hard, clean laundry can sometimes become a luxury and we're proud to step in to help provide this small dignity to folks in need."

#### SUMMIT FRESH MOBILE MARKET OFFERS GROCERIES TO UNDERSERVED AREAS

The Summit Fresh Mobile Market will officially launch this summer. The mobile market is a converted bus packed with produce, dairy products, meat and shelf-stable items that travels to various areas around Akron to offer residents access to fresh groceries. Funding for the project will come from a \$175,000 grant from the American Beverage Foundation for a Healthy America and the United States Conference of Mayors. Local support was provided by the Church of Our Saviour, Open M, Crown Point Ecology Center and United Disability Services. "As a community, when we hear of an issue, we pull together to address it, and that's what is happening here," Executive Director of Summit Fresh Mobile Market Ebony Yeboah-Amankwah said in a news release. "We have learned that there are pockets that do not have reasonable access to fresh, healthy, affordable foods and that is creating adverse impacts to the health of our neighbors in these communities."







The Celebration and Memorial Courtyard, surrounded by our building, is a place for celebration, reflection, and for remembering departed loved ones, both those whose ashes are interred in the courtyard and those buried elsewhere.

Some activities and projects from the Courtyard Team last year were:

- Two interments, one remembrance nameplate posted, four contracts signed for future interments
- Outdoor Kinship Café between Sunday services in July
- Temple talk describing our mission
- New full color brochure (available near all church entrances)
- Workshop on "Getting Your Affairs in Order," with 22 attendees (to be repeated next fall)

Taking care of the Celebration and Memorial Courtyard is also our responsibility. In addition to some paid maintenance and improvements, we have had many volunteer hours given by both Team members and others who have worked with us. Recent volunteer projects include:

- With assistance from two Scouts from Troop 390, removing weeds and moss between pavers
- Installing polymeric sand between pavers to prevent growth of moss and weeds
- Removing irrigation system damaged by freezing and thawing
- Securing the blocks in the seating wall

This year we plan to apply mulch, replace the irrigation system, and address health of the trees and shrubs.

We urge you to visit the Courtyard and enjoy it for celebration, remembrance, and meditation. As you think about life's milestones, we also encourage you to consider it for interment and memorial planning.
