Pastor's Pondering Pastor Jean M. Hansen

Time is passing quickly, as it is inclined to do, and soon it will be January 31, 2026, my retirement date. I have so much to do in terms of cleaning out my office and files before then, which is not nearly as important as saying good-bye well as these weeks unfold.

I've been reflecting on the past 24 years as Pastor here at FLC and recently pulled up a document I created on my 20th anniversary as Faith's pastor. It highlights events that occurred during those years. I decided to jog some readers' memories – and introduce new information to others – by sharing some (not all) items from that list this month and in December.

Please note, though, that while this time-line is filled with notations concerning projects, programs, events, initiatives and ministry focus, it is very SHORT on what makes ministry happen in a congregation – FAITH and PEOPLE who commit themselves to support and do the day-to-day, week-to-week, month-to-month, year-to-year "work" of the church. There is not enough room on any document to list them all, or express appropriate gratitude for their serving.

May 6, 2002 to December 2002

- Pastor Jean Hansen begins as pastor at FLC.
- Hans Zbinden retires and Bob Mollard joins FLC as organist in October.
- The part-time Office Manager position becomes a full-time Administrative Manager position with benefits Judy Lee moves from part-time to full-time role.
- Youth Director John Maroni goes to seminary full-time; plans are made for a part-time position.
- A full-time Minister of Christian Growth and Discipleship position is developed, with a goal of funding/hiring for the position in late 2003.

2003

Risk and Change theme introduced, as well as being intentional in planning and stewardship!
 "New Dimensions: Growing in Discipleship" program paves the way for hiring Carolyn Wagar-Hier in December 2003

2004

- Leo and Wendy Boes take over as Youth Directors.
- DETOUR outreach worship is launched.
- Studies/surveys begin re. worship schedule (3 services needed?) and building use/expansion.

2005

- The move is made from three services to two (9:15 a.m. traditional and 10:30 a.m. contemporary).
- Kinship Café begins.
- DETOUR ends but was "successful" in terms of members sharing their faith.
- 50th Anniversary of the church's founding is celebrated.
- Space Task Force is formed to make recommendations re. education/youth and gathering space.

2006

Space Task Force leads to the establishment of a Building Team and Building Finance Team. Creation
of initial drawings begins.

2007

"2b Transformed: Gathering and Growing Disciples for Mission" proposed building project and capital campaign plans presented to the congregation. A Capital Campaign is held.

2008

- Cell Tower Project (controversy) prayerfully considered and declined.
- Construction bids on "2b Transformed" Project are too costly; plans are to be revised.
 - New sound system is installed in the Sanctuary.

2009

- Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing (MEP) phase of "2bTransformed" project is done (asbestos abated and old boilers extracted; new water service loop, electrical distribution service, pipes, pumps, boilers, fire alarm system).
- A Community Garden is initiated.

2010

- "More Than Enough" Stewardship emphasis initiated \$2,000 becomes \$18,000 to bless others.
- Building Team re-organizes and considers ways to make changes that enhance ministry and enables FLC to share God's grace.

2011

- Focus is on spiritual discernment and prayer regarding the congregation's future and the proposed Building Renewal Plan.
- VBS returns after an absence of several years.
- Flat roofs are replaced.

2012

- Brainstorming Sessions concerning the congregation's future surface two objectives: youth ministry and community outreach.
- Wendy Boes departs as Preschool Director (20 years!) and Dineen Dowling assumes that position/ ministry.
- Eric Jezewski joins church staff as Youth Director in December.
- Consideration is given to purchasing a vacant church building on Cleveland-Massillon Rd. and forming a ministry partnership (school for autistic children).

Years 2013 to 2025 will be featured in the December newsletter!



Business - Call Process Update

As we move through "Phase 1: Saying Farewell" of our transition process, Council asked Nancy Hooper to begin scheduling pastors for the immediate period following Pastor Jean's retirement. She has successfully found coverage for nearly all dates through April. This was no small task considering the need to find coverage for Holy Week services during that time. Thanks are due to Nancy for her efforts, Pastor Jean for her recommendations, and to Pastors Sandy Selby and Andrew Courtney for their willingness to lead worship and preach for the bulk of those dates.

The next step to an interim pastor being appointed is for a small group of congregation leaders to meet with Pastor Mitch Phillips (Assistant to the Bishop for Leadership) to provide him with insights into some of our immediate needs. This will assist the Office of the Bishop in their search to provide us with an intentional interim pastor to guide us until the call process is complete. The goal will be to meet with him sometime in November, so this search can begin as soon as possible.

Council has identified several members to make up the official Transition Team. This group will be under the guidance of Pastor Nathan Krause (Assistant to the Bishop for Congregational Vitality) and the interim pastor (once appointed) to make a clear and honest assessment of the congregation, clarify our mission and goals, and determine the appropriate staffing to lead us towards those goals. The information this team gathers will be used by the Call Committee to create a Ministry Site Profile (sort of a resume for Faith) and will inform their search in finding a permanent called pastor. The Transition Team will become active in February following the conclusion of Pastor Jean's call.

There are two important dates to add to your calendar in January. Wendy Gajarsky is leading a team that is planning a retirement celebration for Pastor Jean. This will be an open house format, planned for Saturday, January 24, from 2 to 4 p.m. in the Welcome Center. The following day Sunday, January 25, Pastor Jean will be preaching her final sermon as lead pastor at Faith Lutheran Church. She plans to preside over both the Traditional and Informal Worship Services that day. Please plan to attend and thank Pastor Jean for her many years of spiritual care and leadership at Faith.

Your Congregation Council members meet once a month to oversee and guide the church's mission and ministry. There are nine members who are serving 3-year elected terms. This month we introduce **Dr. Fedearia Nicholson-Sweval**.



Fedearia is Dean of the Williams Honors College and Vice Provost for Student Pathways at The University of Akron. She leads the Williams Honors College, serving more than 1,600 students, with a focus on fostering rigorous academic experiences and meaningful engagement within the Akron community. In her role as Vice Provost, she oversees campus-wide advising, the Student Success Team, and key initiatives such as New Student Orientation, Learning Communities, academic support services, Choose Ohio First, Educational Outreach and pathways programs, including early college high schools, College Credit Plus and Trio Program, just to name a few.

Previously, Dr. Nicholson-Sweval served as Dean of Student Success at Stark State College and Assistant Vice President for Student Success at The University of Akron, where she advanced retention and access and established and led programs, including founding the nationally recognized Black Male Summit.

Her contributions have been recognized by *Kaleidoscope* magazine, the Greater Akron Chamber of Commerce, and with the Harold K. Stubbs Humanitarian Award for Distinguished Service in Education. A graduate of Leadership Akron, she serves on the boards of the American Red Cross of Greater Akron and the Mahoning Valley, the Akron Roundtable, the United Way of Summit and Medina County, and on the Advisory Board for the Center for Immersive Leadership.

She has been a member of Faith Lutheran Church for five years. She enjoys being involved in ministry and currently serves on Church Council and is the liaison for Ministry and Staff Development, serves as a Communion Server and will be coordinating this year's annual Tinsel and Tea.

In her past time, she enjoys spending time with family and friends, traveling, reading and hosting social gatherings at her home. She resides in Northwest Akron with her nephew Izaiah and favorite pooch, Ernie.



INTERFAITH JUSTICE ALLIANCE

Both the theme and the dates have been determined by the planning committee. The topics for the next sessions are food deserts, food accessibility, food policy, nutrition deficiency and its health consequences as well as solutions toward ameliorating circumstances in our community. The dates are February 25, March 4, 11 and 18. A follow-up session, not yet scheduled, will take place to explore and define how solutions may be implemented both across the alliance partners and within each congregation. Although there are five congregation members of this alliance, presentations will take place at only 4 sites which are New Hope Baptist Church, Temple Israel, Prince of Peace Baptist Church and St. Hilary Church. Faith Lutheran Church will partner with Prince of Peace to jointly host that session at their location. *Thus, there will not be an alliance presentation at Faith Lutheran next year.* For information related to the chosen theme, see the Akron Beacon Journal article from October 11, reprinted in this newsletter beginning on page 13.

SALVATION ARMY



We will soon be receiving 30 tags for the Angel Tree 'Adopt a Child' program. After last year's participation in this program there were some who expressed concern about the financial expectations associated with the tag list requests, the variable gift equity and the gift distribution procedures. After discussion with our Outreach Advisory Team, David Simpson reviewed these concerns with Cheryl Knerien who coordinates the program for the Salvation Army. She clarified their expectations with the following message:

Families from all over Summit County can register for assistance with toys for Christmas. After the registration process the children's wishes are placed on "Angel Tags". Other information is added to the tag, so donors know a little about the child. It is up to the donor to

decide what they can purchase for the child and what they would like to do. Each child will receive everything listed on the tag. Even if donors do not purchase the entire list of items, the Salvation Army will supplement as we can to make sure that each child has a good Christmas.

Thus, there is no expectation that donors purchase all the listed items

ELCA "DAY OF SERVICE" REVIEW

For next year a suggestion was made to conduct our internal project in the Kinship Café to elicit greater participation. Earlier planning was also recommended for identifying our external community service project and to determine if participation with any of the First Serve activities would be appropriate. For the past two years First Serve held its annual day of service on the same day as our ELCA "God's Work, Our Hands" program and coordination has been challenging.


On October 9, more than 50 condiment bottles were delivered to Family Promise as well as the second batch of soup, prepared by our Soup Ministry Team.

DLM HALLOWEEN THEME



BEACON JOURNAL ARTICLE Mobile grocery store drives to Summit County food deserts



Summit Fresh's new mobile grocery store bus

By Corey O'Leary, Oct. 11, 2025 - AKRON, Ohio - A Summit County non-profit is combatting food deserts by taking groceries directly to neighborhoods with low food access.

- Summit Fresh is a non-profit that launched their mobile grocery store.
- The vehicle was made possible by a \$175,000 grant.
- The store will operate on Saturdays and Mondays at various 'food desert' locations.

"Summit Fresh is a Mobile Grocery store," said Ebony Yeboah-Amankwah, the executive director of Summit Fresh Mobile Market. "It's a grocery store on wheels, and it goes into areas designated as food deserts and provides a grocery store experience."

The non-profit has been providing groceries to Akron and surrounding communities for more than a year now, utilizing a different vehicle provided by a Youngstown organization. Now, they've purchased their own by using a grant they received for \$175,000.

"What are those items that a person needs?" Yeboah-Amankwah said. "They can kind of go through the truck and have everything that they need for a week."

Summit Fresh plans to take the truck out to various locations in Summit County, such as the Reach Opportunity Center at Summit Lake.

"Actually, a lot of times people reach out and say, 'we really need this at our location,'" Yeboah-Amankwah said.

Shoppers heading inside the bus can browse kitchen staples like milk, eggs, fresh produce and meat. They can exit on the other side of the bus to pay and bag their groceries.

"Groceries, and particularly healthy groceries, in the city are not always easy to get to, especially if you don't have a vehicle," said Akron Mayor Shammas Malik.

Malik said there is a need in Akron and surrounding communities for increased food access.

According to the Summit County Department of Health, roughly 30,000 Summit County residents live in food deserts.

"Based on where they live, whether they have access to fresh, healthy, affordable food gives them a disproportionately high number of health-related diseases and also a shorter lifespan," Yeboeh Amankwah said.

Access to that fresh food can make a big difference.

"It is simple. Access to fresh, healthy, affordable food creates healthier communities," Yeboah-Amankwah said.

RELENTLESS 330

On Saturday, October 11, at the very same time that we were engaged in the DLM ministry at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Relentless 330 was immediately across the street in Grace Park serving a hot meal, distributing fresh fruit and vegetables and giving out clothing to the homeless people waiting in a long line.

GARDEN CITY CHURCH GARDEN PROVIDES FOOD IN KENMORE FOOD DESERT

One corner in Kenmore is looking a bit more green and orderly these days thanks to an Akron church's initiative. West Akron's *Garden City Church* sponsored the creation of a community garden near one of the city's food deserts. The project came to fruition in late July and has been giving free fresh produce to those in need ever since. Organizers Andy and Jen Harris distribute the produce to residents and hope to expand the garden's impact as they continue to grow and refine their processes. The nearly 3,000-square-foot enclosed garden grows broccoli, kale, potatoes, carrots, beans, peppers, carrots, tomatoes, spinach, blackberries, strawberries, raspberries and blueberries.

The plot of land where the garden now resides was a mass of brush, large stumps and a dying crab apple tree before volunteers cleared the space in April. Andy estimates it cost \$5,000 for the lumber, fencing, plants and soil to create the garden. The earth was tilled, garden soil was deposited and planting was wrapped up by mid-June. Over half a dozen volunteers regularly care for the garden.
