MESSAGE FROM SUPPLY PREACHERS

ANDREW COURTNEY AND SANDY SELBY



We will be serving as Supply Preachers and participating in worship leadership on most Sundays while the search for an interim pastor is in process. We do this both as pastors and as fellow members of Faith Lutheran Church who, like you, will be grieving the departure of Pastor Jean as we enter into the uncertainty of the transition period between her departure and the arrival of our next called pastor. It is a privilege for us to serve the people of Faith as Supply Preachers at this time in the life of our congregation.

In our Homiletics classes in seminary, we learned to prepare to preach God's Word by studying the Scriptures appointed for the day and engaging with the question: "What is God's Word for *this* people, in *this* place, today?" From the gospel passages in the lectionary in early February, we will hear of both the blessings and the challenges that are ours as followers of Jesus, and engage with how those blessings and challenges that Jesus places before us inform and shape our lives as Christians, today.

In mid-February, the season of Epiphany ends with Transfiguration Sunday. When Jesus' appearance is transfigured in glory on the mountaintop, God says to the disciples who are nearby, cowering in fear, "This is my Son, listen to him!" From there, we turn to Ash Wednesday and the Lenten journey of reflection and discernment during which we open ourselves to listen to God's Word of challenge, encouragement, and comfort as we spend those forty days of Lent with Jesus, in the wilderness.

It seems somehow appropriate that we enter into the wilderness context of the season of Lent even as we, the people of Faith Lutheran Church, enter a transition time that may at times feel to us like wilderness. The blessing for us, as followers of Christ, is that in the wilderness, God has a Word for the people of Faith Lutheran Church, today: a Word of calling to discipleship in community; a Word of blessing; a Word of God's transforming power and grace; a Word of God's abiding presence. And a reminder that, no matter the wilderness in which we find ourselves, God's steadfast love will always have the last word.

As we pastors like to say: "That'll preach!"

Introducing Pastor Andrew Courtney & Pastor Sandy Selby

Rev. Andrew Courtney is an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ and was a military chaplain in the Ohio Army National Guard. He has served in congregational ministry, chaplaincy, and community-based settings, with experience as a senior pastor, associate pastor, and chaplain. Pastor Andrew's ministry is shaped by a deep commitment to pastoral care, thoughtful preaching, interfaith engagement, and helping people navigate questions of meaning, vocation, and faith with honesty and compassion.

In addition to his ministry work, Andrew serves in a leadership role in cybersecurity leading a regional team across North and South America, where he focuses on ethics, leadership development, and mentoring young professionals. He also recently transitioned to the Air National Guard as an intelligence officer.

He is particularly interested in the intersections of faith, justice, health, and spiritual resilience, as well as outdoor and contemplative spiritual practices. Pastor Andrew lives in Cuyahoga Falls with his wife--Pastor Sarah--and children--Asher, Annabelle, and Sammy. He is grateful to be part of the Faith Lutheran Church community, where Pastor Sarah serves on staff. He is honored to serve as a pulpit supply pastor at Faith Lutheran Church during February.

Rev. Dr. Sandy Selby came to Akron in 1981 to work for BFGoodrich, where she worked for eighteen years in finance and strategic planning before following a call to ministry. While in seminary at Methodist Theological School in Ohio, Pastor Sandy felt drawn to the ministry of chaplaincy. For twenty years, she served as an on-call chaplain at Cleveland Clinic Akron General and Akron Children's Hospital, and as Pastor of Furnace Street Mission, a 100 year-old church that provides community-based ministry to those who work in the safety forces and in health and human services. She recently completed a year of service as Bridge Pastor at Westminster Presbyterian Church during their search for their next pastor.

In her ministry, Pastor Sandy seeks to encourage others to join in the journey to find meaning, beloved community, and opportunities for service through deepening our relationship with God as we seek to build God's Reign of justice, peace, and well-being for all. She has a deep commitment to inclusion and interfaith engagement. She enjoys preaching and its challenge to engage with Scripture within the context of the world in which we live, locally and globally.

A native of New Jersey, Pastor Sandy is fond of saying, "I moved to Akron for two or three years, forty-five years ago." What has kept her here in Akron are her circle of friends; Faith Lutheran Church, which she joined in 2008; regional arts and culture; community engagement; and the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, where she serves as a volunteer and, weather permitting, hikes or bikes several times per week.

Business - Call Process Update

Dear members and friends of Faith Lutheran Church,

The last six months have passed quickly and as I write this letter, we are preparing to celebrate Pastor Jean's retirement. There was a flurry of activity in the late summer into the fall to prepare us as we enter into the next phase of the call process. On behalf of the Congregation Council, I wanted to remind you with a brief outline of the transition process, update you on the preparations the Council has taken so far, and inform you of our plans for the second phase of transition. Our goal is to continue providing regular communication through monthly announcements and by letter when reaching major milestones in the transition process.

As a review, this is an outline of the process the ELCA has created for churches as they search for a new called pastor (and reflects activity at the time this letter is received). The Synod will provide guidance and assistance throughout these phases.

- Phase 1: Saying Farewell (complete) – began with the announcement of Pastor Jean's retirement. The Council met with the bishop and began planning for transitional leadership. This phase ended with the conclusion of Pastor Jean's ministry on February 1, 2026.
- **Phase 2: Congregation Health & Identity (current) – began February 2, 2026. A transition team has been formed to evaluate the congregation's sustainability and vitality. The team, with assistance from the bishop's office, will review our current mission and assist with discerning a vision for the future, while determining the staffing needed to meet those goals.**
- Phase 3: Entering the Call process – a formal Call Committee (elected by Council) is formed. With the information gleaned from Phase 2, a Ministry Site Profile is created. The Committee receives and interviews candidates.
- Phase 4: Primary Candidate – the Call Committee recommends a candidate to Council. The congregation is introduced to the candidate. A Congregation Meeting is held with a call vote.
- Phase 5: Welcoming & Celebrating – rostered minister's move and start date are arranged. An installation service is scheduled.

There is no set time for this transition process to be completed but it is likely to take somewhere between 8 and 18 months following the start of Phase 2, although it may take longer.

A group of church leaders met with Pastor Mitch Phillips (Assistant to the Bishop for Leadership) on November 17 to provide insight into the more immediate needs of the congregation during the early period of the transition process. The goal is to have an intentional full-time interim pastor to guide us until the call process is complete. We are awaiting candidates to be provided by the Office of the Bishop. Once identified, they will be interviewed; a final candidate will be chosen by Council and then presented to the congregation.

In the meantime, covering pastors have been secured through April, including Holy Week. There will continue to be traditional and informal services, although the structure of these may be slightly different depending on the presiding pastor. The Worship Team is actively planning to ensure the covering pastors have all they need for service. In addition, Pastor Jean has formed a Visitation Team that will be visiting members who are unable to attend services in person. Besides her pastoral duties, Pastor Jean had many administrative responsibilities, and Council is working to ensure all those are covered as well.

The official Transition Team will be under the guidance of Pastor Nathan Krause (Assistant to the Bishop for Congregational Vitality) and the interim pastor (once appointed) to make a clear and honest assessment of the congregation, clarify our mission and goals, and determine the appropriate staffing to lead us towards those goals. The first official meeting with Pastor Krause will be in mid-February. The information this team gathers will be used by the Call Committee to create a Ministry Site Profile (similar to a resume) for Faith and will inform our search in finding a permanent called pastor.

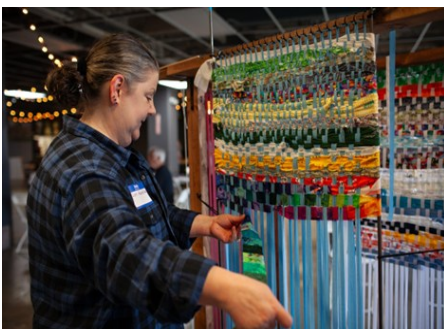

Women's Interfaith Spiritual Heritage (WISH) in collaboration with developed AAIC developed the Tapestry of Unity, a weaving project of art and craft form including prayers, poetry and reflection. Many Akron based faith communities participated in creating this work. Each participant wrote their prayer, wish, dream or hope on a strip of fabric which were woven onto the tapestry forming one united piece. The back of the tapestry is African fabric that was discovered by a community member during their Peace Corps service. It is hoped that it will become a symbol of our community's strength representing the weft and warp of our unity. The tapestry is now available through a travelling exhibit for interested congregations and organizations. It has already been on display the Akron Main Library, Bath Church UCC, Akron Art Museum, The John Brown House. St Vincent DePaul Catholic Church, Church of Our Savior and

First Congregational Church. It is currently being hosted at Trinity Lutheran Church of Kent. We will explore hosting it here for a short period sometime after the Easter season.

Faith's book club is reading **Anxious People**, a novel from the author of **A Man Called Ove**, by Fredrik Backman. There's a wealthy bank director who has been too busy to care about anyone else and a young couple who are about to have their first child but can't seem to agree on anything. Each of them carries a lifetime of grievances, hurts, secrets, and passions that are ready to boil over. None of them is entirely who they appear to be. And all of them, the bank robber included, desperately crave some sort of rescue. As the authorities and the media surround the premises, these reluctant allies will reveal surprising truths about themselves and set in motion a chain of events so unexpected that even they can hardly explain what happens next.
