Business - Call Process Update

The first few months of our Transition Process have been full of activity. February initiated the formal work of our Transition Team and throughout March we focused on completing our congregation's health and vitality assessment. April brought us the opportunity to review "The Story of Faith," providing perspective of Faith's and St. John/St. Paul's congregational histories prior to our combining and our shared history over the past decade. This is all critical work to help us see where God wants us to focus going into the future and in preparing us for the call process, so we find the right pastor to guide us in that mission.

This month we welcome the Reverend Doctor Bruce Roth and his family as he takes on the role of interim pastor. Pastor Roth earned his Master of Divinity in Pastoral Leadership from Trinity Lutheran Seminary and his Doctorate in Missional Leadership from The Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. He retired from St. Stephen Martyr Lutheran Church in Canton after 25 years as their lead pastor, leading a growing and vibrant congregation. Besides leading worship and providing pastoral care, his vision and skills in strategic planning and execution are important assets as Faith navigates this Transition and prepares for a new called pastor.

We have hired him at "three quarters" time, with 30 hours weekly (knowing that there are no set hours for a pastor) and leading worship three of the four Sundays per month. Council will continue to arrange supply pastors and coverage for pastoral care during the remaining time.

During my time on Council, I have been the liaison for our Operations teams and was amazed at how much planning and work was done by groups of volunteers to manage and maintain the church finances and physical plant. During the Transition, I have been fortunate to get an even broader picture of the activities of the volunteers and staff that plan and lead worship, organize social activities, provide administrative and staff support, lead small groups, provide leadership and guidance for the Preschool, guide and participate in outreach, and all the other activities that help keep Faith running and provide the ability to help our community. For many, the last few months have added extra duties and time. I want to thank everyone for their dedication and assistance in continuing Faith's mission of worshipping God, growing in faith, and offering hope.

I also want to thank Pastor Andrew Courtney and the Reverend Doctor Sandy Selby for providing worship and pastoral care over the last few months as we searched for an interim pastor.

Due to prior commitments, Pastor Roth will begin leading worship services on **May 17**. Please plan to attend in person or via livestream.

As always, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact me or any other Council member.

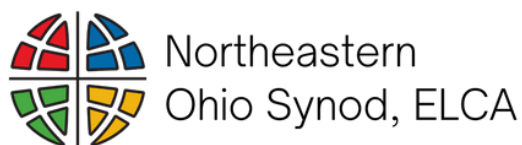


The Gardeners of Greater Akron Annual Geranium Sale

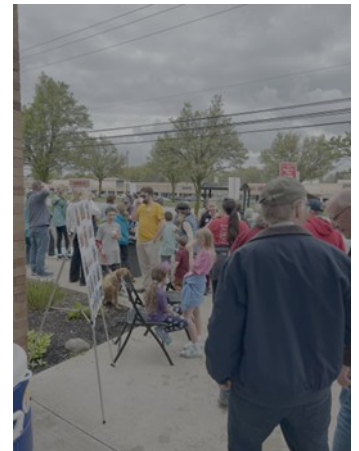
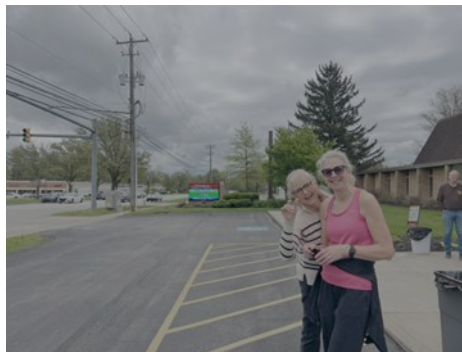

TAPESTRY – TO BE ON DISPLAY HERE FROM APRIL 29 TO MAY 12

Women's Interfaith Spiritual Heritage (WISH) in collaboration with **AAIC** developed the **Tapestry of Unity**, a weaving project of art and craft form including prayers, poetry and reflection. Many Akron based faith communities participated in creating this work. Participants wrote their prayer, wish, dream or hope on a strip of fabric which were woven onto the tapestry forming one united piece. The back of the tapestry is African fabric that was discovered by a community member during their Peace Corps service. It is hoped that it

will become a symbol of our community's strength represented in the weft and warp of our unity. The tapestry has been displayed through a travelling exhibit for various congregations and organizations. It has already been on display the Akron Main Library, Bath Church UCC, Akron Art Museum, The John Brown House, St Vincent DePaul Catholic Church, Church of Our Savior and First Congregational Church and Trinity Lutheran ELCA Church of Kent. We will be hosting it here for two weeks from **April 29 to May 12**. The tapestry will not only present an opportunity to view the artistic piece but also to appreciate the prayers, thoughts and reflections it includes. The display will be accompanied with booklet in which you may also share your own reflections.



AAIC Voting Member Opportunity

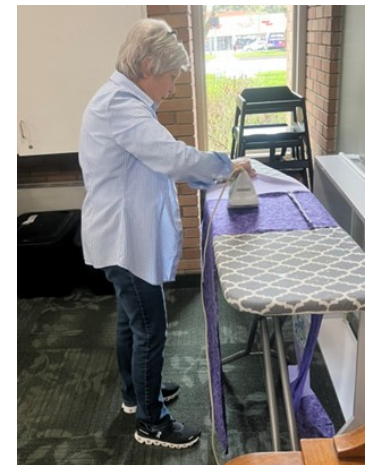
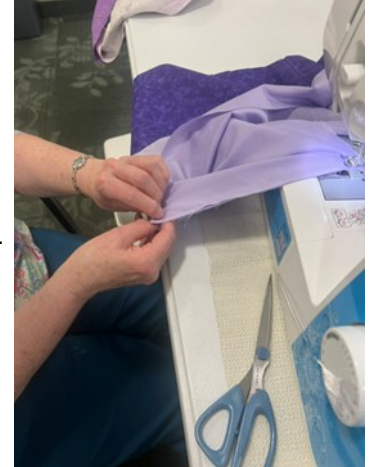

BUSY FINGERS

The Busy Fingers team has been making patch-work quilts for over 50 years. The team cuts fabric, rip seams, pin fabric pieces together and assemble them into a twin-size quilt top and then finally sew all the pieces together to make a quilt or blanket. The goal is to make 100 quilts a year. The quilts are then distributed through OPEN M. While the assembly process has evolved over the years, all the quilts are made from donated fabrics. Cottons, flannels and fleece (prints and solids), are primarily used, but any kind, curtains, flannel shirts, sheets, tablecloths as well as yardage of fabric are accepted as is sewing thread.

The Busy Fingers team meets every Tuesday morning from 9:30-11:30 a.m. in Faith's Fellowship Hall. You do not need to be a seamstress to help. Jobs are plentiful. Please contact Debbie Gottas for more information at 330-592-4251.

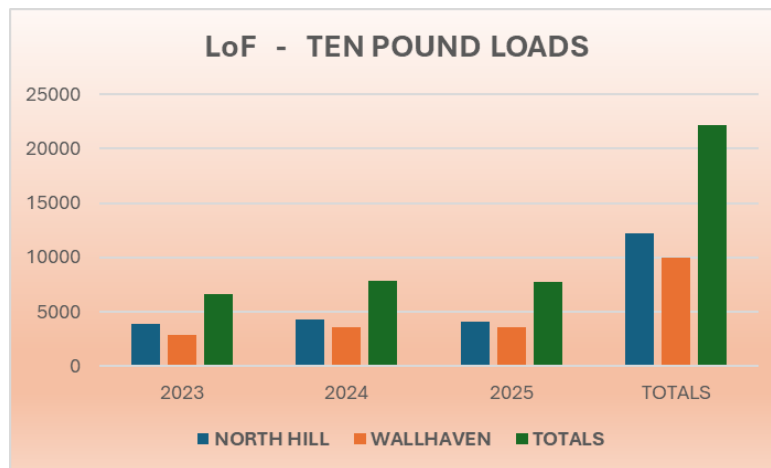
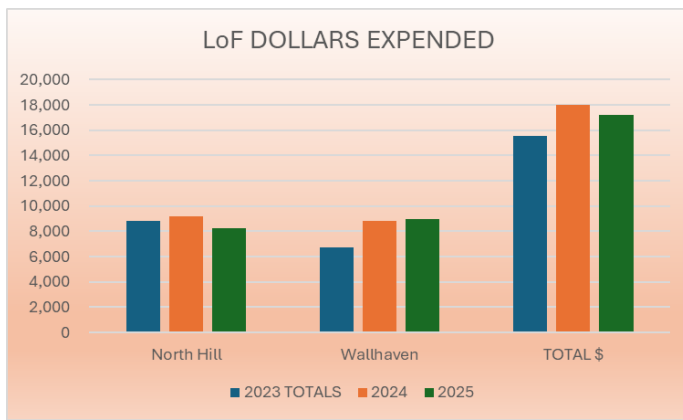
The RIC Team has begun planning for national Pride Month which is in June. It is also exploring the possibility for a special presentation on a relevant subject.

Good morning! I hope you all have had a chance to enjoy the spring-like weather!

As you know, Family Promise is in a very exciting period of rapid growth. With the addition of Forest Glen and Glendora II, we will soon be able to serve up to seventeen families at a time. We are quickly approaching the opening of Forest Glen, which will add five additional units. We are incredibly grateful to share that we already have volunteers who have offered to help manage the pantry.

Several congregations have generously offered to provide additional food items to help accommodate the new families, and we are so thankful for your continued support. We also understand that many of you are already giving so much, and there is absolutely no expectation to do more. Please know how much we appreciate everything you already do.

We will be seeking additional community support to help meet the increased need, but I wanted to reach out to this core group first. Some coordinators have mentioned they may have room in their budgets to contribute additional items, while others may not, and we completely understand both situations.

Since several of you have expressed interest in helping further, I would like to get a sense of what additional items you may be able to provide. This will help us identify any gaps and allow us to recruit additional food donors where needed.
