Pastor's Pondering

The theme for this year's Stewardship Emphasis is **Gardeners for God: Growing Together!** Since I am an actual dig-in-the-dirt lover of gardening, it's a concept that works for me. I'm always amazed when late August, early September arrives and the garden is at its peak, that in such a short time – three months - so much food has been produced. It has not been without effort, of course, and there have been battles against critters, bugs, disease and drought to wage. Still, the earth has yielded its harvest. In that, there is reason to marvel and to give thanks. So, our being gardeners for God is an image I can grasp, as does the passage from 2 Corinthians 9:10 that is the theme verse:

“He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will...increase the harvest of your righteousness.”

In that verse, the focus is on the seeds God provides the sower (gardener) – our abilities, our financial resources, our time, our faith. Think of those tiny zinnia seeds planted in May, seeds created and gifted to us by God. When tended intentionally, they grow to not only provide beauty to the garden, but also assist with the pollinating process required for a garden to flourish.

In the same way, when we use and tend the “seeds” (abilities, resources, etc...) provided by God, they lead to the flourishing of the Gospel and of God's love.

And, when we take into ourselves the bread that God provides – God's grace, God's word, Holy Communion, Jesus himself – our faith is nourished and grows.

The result of tending the seed and being fed by the bread is an increase in the harvest of righteousness, which is the producing of goodness, integrity, justice, in our lives and in the world.

Harvesting righteousness is the ultimate goal of our stewardship emphasis, and you too can join in growing together as a Gardner for God.

“The Chosen” Returns in October



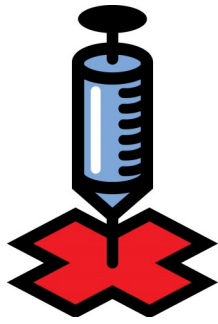

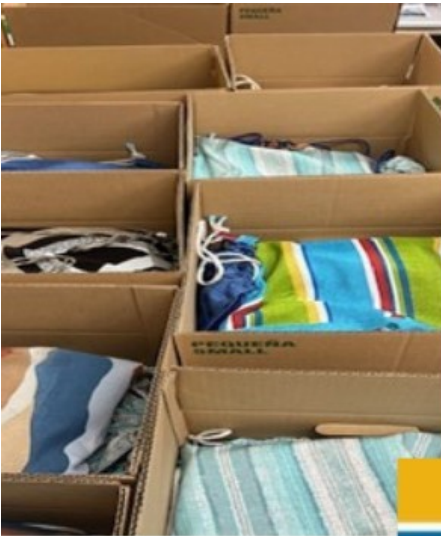

Our 2024-2025 school year is off to a great start! Students and teachers are in a rhythm and routine of the school day, and learning has begun in earnest.

Faith church member Amanda Hyter leads the Turtle Tots for Twos (a Mom, Dad, and Me class), which has grown to three classes—a Monday, Wednesday, and Friday! We are so glad to offer this introduction to the preschool experience for those 2 year olds and their grown ups!

Our two Three Year Old Classes (T/TH and MWF) are smaller in number, but strong nonetheless! They will be heading to Nick-A-Jack farms for a field trip this month. These classes work on identifying colors and shapes, finding their name, being a good friend by sharing and taking turns, and following directions like cleaning up, lining up and sitting in circle.

Our two older classes of Four & Five Year Olds are designed as "Kindergarten Readiness" classes. These students work on writing their name correctly (first letter capital and the rest lower case), counting, and lots of pre-reading activities. We use Zoo-phonics and Heggerty Phonemic Awareness programs in the classes.

All teachers create activities that will build fine motor strength (like playdough and LEGO building) so small hands are ready to hold and manipulate pencils and markers! Working on that pincer grasp is an important skill we incorporate every day!

All teachers carve out time for music, movement, and gross motor play, so those little bodies can run and move and grow stronger every day!

All teachers see each student as a child of God, deserving of love and respect! We speak with kind voices with the goal of helping the children in our care navigate this amazing time of growth in their little lives! We celebrate each bit of progress made! It is a joy and honor to be in the presence of these gifts of God!

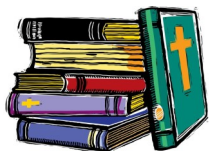

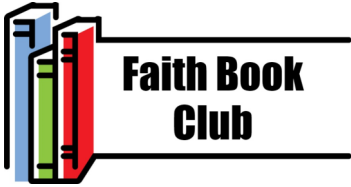

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH DONATION ACCEPTANCE POLICY EFFECTIVE AS OF AUGUST 1, 2024

The purpose of the Donation Acceptance Policy is to list the type of donations that can be accepted by FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH. In order to protect the interests of FAITH and the persons or other entities who support the programs, this policy is intended to assure that all donations to FAITH, or for the use of FAITH, are structured to provide maximum benefit to all parties. Donations to FAITH must be in the form of cash, checks (including distributions from third-party estates or financial institutions), and on-line ACH/credit card payments. This Donation Policy supersedes any previous known or unknown donation, gift or memorial fund policies and will go into effect as of August 1, 2024. FAITH can no longer accept or honor donations or gifts made to other causes or perceived needs of FAITH, without FAITH CHURCH Council approval. This policy is subject to change at the discretion of FAITH Church Council.

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE DONATIONS TO THE CHURCH:

- 1) Operating Account – now includes Memorial Donations, Special Giving, and Initial Offerings.
- 2) Building & Grounds
- 3) Outreach – includes, but not limited to DLM, Loads of Faith and Prayer Shawls
- 4) Oasis
- 5) Lutheran World Hunger
- 6) ELCA Disaster Relief - includes other recognized ELCA causes
- 7) Flowers – includes Altar Flowers and Seasonal Flowers. Not Tax Deductible
- 8) Courtyard - Donations are deductible, Fees for Internment are Not Tax Deductible
- 9) Special Assistance (Gift) – up to a maximum of \$500/year per individual donor. Donations cannot be earmarked for specific individuals.
- 10) Faith Endowment Fund
- 11) Individual Donations \$5,000 or greater – will be considered for donation for a specific ministry or purpose that is not a listed acceptable donation, with the express, advanced recommendation by the Finance Committee and written approval of FAITH Church Council.
- 12) Non-Cash/Check Donations - will be considered for donation for a specific ministry or purpose with the express, advanced recommendation by the Finance Committee and written approval of FAITH Church Council.

Please note: Donations for the Faith Preschool or the St. John/St. Paul Endowment Fund must be made directly to the organization or bank account.
